Syllabus Prescribed for PG Diploma in Tribal Studies Examination

There shall be five compulsory papers which includes four theory papers (of 100 marks each) of three hours duration and Dissertation Viva-Voce examination (of 100 marks) as one compulsory paper.

Note : The valuation of the dissertation shall be done by one external examiner. Beside the valuation a viva-voce examination of the dissertation shall be conducted by a board of three examiners i.e. The External Examiner, Supervisor of the candidate & Head of the Department. The ratio of marks for dissertation & viva-voce shall be 7:3 respectively.
